



Welcome to Georgia

Hello all, well this is new for me, not being a freedom fighter, being a newspaper man. So, let's start with a little background, for those of you who do not know me. I have been riding motorcycles for over 50 years and been in and around the motorcycle world in Georgia for the last 30 + years. I have owned and ridden everything from Honda to Harleys and at this time ride a Victory CCT. As of November 2021, I was appointed as State Legislative Director for ABATE of Georgia, and as of January 2022, I was appointed as State Rep. for the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF). Of which I take both positions very serious and will work hard to ensure that what's important to the



members is translated into action. OK, enough about me, that's not why you came here, so let me tell you a little about what's been going on.

Georgia has built a great leadership team as well as a very dedicated Legislative team. Together we have focused our efforts on moving our agenda forward.

With the Georgia General Assembly in recess, the time is now to build or rebuild the relationships that have been so important to achieving the goal's we have set. Due to this being an election year, the auestion is, who or what do you start with?

Currently there are 5 House Bills and 4 Senate Bills that we are following very closely. Bills that have the possibility of making major changes to how we ride, repair and in general, enjoy our way of life. At this time those bills are set to be reintroduced in the upcoming 2023 session.

With the 2023 session rapidly approaching, ABATE of Georgia stands at the ready to work with our Legislators on the issues facing us in the future. Ready to introduce ideas and bills such as, Lane Filtering, Motorcycle Profiling, and Increased Penalties for causing a motorcyclist death or serious injury.

Recently members of ABATE of Georgia traveled to our Nation's Capital to work with and learn

from the MRF, during Bikers Inside the Beltway. The team set appointments with our Legislators to discuss issues facing both the MRF and ABATE of Georgia. We met with 10 of our Legislators and or their staff. We discussed everything from Profiling, E-15 fuel, to Autonomous Vehicles and more. While in Washington, one of Georgia's Legislators introduced a bill HR7731 that will improve the transparency of the type of fuel you chose.


Janet Heaney TREASURER

PRETEND YOU ARE INVISIBLE

If you ride a motorcycle, you know that out on the road you might as well be transparent, because car drivers often look right past you. They might notice the car or truck behind you, but *you*, in all your "narrowness," may not register in the visual cortex of even the most alert drivers.

That's why an oncoming car driver might turn left in front of you at an intersection.





That's also why a driver in the next lane, even if they turn and look in your direction before changing lanes, might veer into your lane.





Sadly, drivers might behave this way even when they're not distracted by their cell phone, GPS, satellite radio, or other form of in-car infotainment. So how do you compensate for being "invisible" to drivers?

Be as conspicuous as possible. Wear bright clothing and a light-colored helmet. Always have your headlight on, and use your high beam or an aftermarket headlight modulator during the day (where allowed).

Take an approved rider training course. Learn how to maneuver your motorcycle in normal and emergency situations, and practice braking and swerving maneuvers often. Also understand that safe riding depends as much on the mental skills of awareness and judgment as it does on the physical skill of maneuvering the machine; respond early to possible hazards instead of having to react instantly to an emergency.

Pretend you're invisible. If you assume others on the road can't see you, and any car that can hit you will hit you, you will tend to ride in a hyperaware mindset and learn to notice every detail in your surroundings. In other words, you will take extra responsibility for your safety and ride defensively. You will vary your speed and lane position to place yourself in the best spot on the road to avoid collisions, plan escape paths in case a driver violates your right-of-way, cover your brake controls to quicken your reactions, use your horn to alert a driver who doesn't notice you, and always ride within your limits.

CAR DRIVERS ONLY SEE WHAT THEY EXPECT TO SEE, AND MOST DON'T EXPECT YOU TO BE PART OF THE TRAFFIC MIX. RIDE WITH THE RIGHT SKILLS, STRATEGIES, AND ATTITUDE. BE SEEN – BE SAFE.

How Much A Motorcycle Paint Job Should Cost

How Much Does It Cost to Paint a Motorcycle

If you recently purchased a used motorcycle or have had a bike for years that needs a paint job, you might be wondering where to start and how much it is going to cost you. Used motorcycle values can retain their cost relatively well, but sometimes prices of motorcycles can be low if someone is looking to offload their hog quickly. However, occasionally the repairs and bring a bike back to life can be expensive.

Luckily, there are a few options to save you money if you are looking to paint your ride. If you have the means to spend, getting a professional bike paint job or even a custom one can be ideal. Doing your own paint work is an option that is worth considering, too.

Regular Paint Jobs

Standard paint jobs for motorcycles will vary and are contingent upon your location, the shop through which you have the paintwork done, and your particular bike. Typical price ranges for having a motorcycle painted vary from around \$300 to \$1,600.

Much of this price depends on how much work needs to be done to your actual bike before the painting can occur. If you just want a standard coat of paint and your motorcycle is in flawless condition, the price will be much lower. If you are not so confident in your DIY skills to paint a bike yourself, hiring someone to do it for around \$300 can be worth the money.

Custom Paint Jobs

If you want to do more than just give your ride a rudimentary coat of paint and you want a custom job with detailed work such as flames stripes or other intricate designs the cost will naturally be much higher. Prices vary depending on location, the artist, the type of shop you decide to go through, as well as the bike.

The average range for custom paint jobs on motorcycles can be around \$800 To \$2,500 depending on the detail of work. For high-end bikes and exceptional custom paint jobs, the cost can skyrocket to anywhere from \$15,000 to \$30,000 depending on the painting.

Young Activist Scholarship Fund Nomination Form

Candidate Criteria:

- 1) Nominated candidate must be between the ages of 18 and 30 with a valid Motorcycle Endorsement on their Driver's License. 31st Birthday must fall after **Meeting Of The Minds** for that year.
- 2) Candidate must be a member in good standing of a State Motorcyclists' Rights Organization (SMRO). Length of membership required in SMRO to be determined by its members if candidate is qualified.
- 3) Candidate must be nominated by their SMRO. Nominations will be accepted from either state or local (District/Chapter/Local) SMRO groups and must be submitted on an MRF approved application form.
- 4) Nomination must be submitted between October 1st and July15th and postmarked no later than July 1st of the year for which the application is submitted.
- 5) The Candidate must also submit a minimum three hundred (300)-word essay on why biker's rights are important to them. A well written essay from the heart is like a picture or blueprint of who the candidate is; coming directly from the candidate, this gives the MRFA&E Board of Directors a better perspective of the individual. Winning candidate will be announced via an MRF E-mail News Release on or about August 15th. The Candidate will be notified with a letter of thanks and encouragement to re-submit their candidacy for the next year if they are not the selected winner.




