April showers bring May flowers so let's discuss some rainy day riding tips:

•Always keep some waterproof gear on your ride (remember to replace your gear every couple of years as the waterproofing usually wears off with use)

•Check those tires (make sure that you have enough tread before hitting the road....it's the only thing between you and the wet pavement)

•Stay off of the painted surfaces! (anyone who has ridden in the rain knows how slippery it gets)

•Don't make any sudden moves! (the best way to keep contact on the wet roadways is to throttle up slowly and break slowly)

•Think about eye wear (a full face or modular helmet is your best bet in the rain.....glasses tend to fog up and allows water to get in between you and the road)

Rain or shine.....be prepared and enjoy the ride!

#### "IF I WERE A BIKER, 1 LIFE AGO"

I am a biker. It is the modern age. I thumb my starter and go. I can cross a continent for the price of a few tanks of gas. Effortlessly, -----relatively. My phone tells me how to suit up for weather I've not stepped foot in. My GPS tells me where to turn and where there's traffic, road construction, and gas stations. Before my drive-way ends, my bike tells me my 'smartphone' has "paired" with my infotainment system. I wirelessly put The Beatles, podcasts, and my favorite books into my earbud-equipped helmet. When it is cold, I switch the heated seat and handgrips on. Very cold, and on with the heated suit. In the heat, I flip the air vents circulating fresh wind into the 'cockpit space.' Antilock brakes ensure my quick stops are safe, radial tires stick me to smooth, fresh pavement, and 'fly by wire' acceleration is fast and dependable.

Thoughts of breaking down do not enter my mind. If they did, my dashboard has provisions to direct me to the nearest Harley dealer or alert my tow service in the minuscule chance of mechanical (or electronic) failure. The list could go on about halogen this and LED that, waterproof this and lightweight that, but why? You get my point. We are wimps. We are pampered with modernity and convenience. Who amongst us has not scoffed at the Gold Wing guy pulling a trailer and queried: 'why not just buy a car?' – All the while, our electronic ignition fires perfect millisec-ond pulses to our platinum spark plugs. Don't judge. It is the way of the world.

Imagine 50 years from now. Internal combustion will be obsolete. Electromagnetic? Organically regenerating power plants? Fusion? Who knows? The suck, bang, blow paradigm of our beloved internal combustion will be a thing of the past. However, you will have lived through it. You will usher in the new dimension if you are a young biker. If you are old, or even middle-aged like me, chances are, you'll not see it, but you'll be told of its coming. The combustion principles that have propelled us forward have not really changed in 120 years. Explode a fuel in a small space, force a piston down a hole, turn a crank, spin some cogs connected to a belt or shaft and propel forward. All that changes are the details of motion and time. We are bikers of new millennia but are descendants of our not too distant biker forbearers. The suck bank blow dynamic has changed little, but it will soon. A bit more dependable, a bit more powerful, WAY more complicated. Progress? It remains to be seen.

I sit in my office and look at the rusted hulk of the 1936 knucklehead hanging on my wall. It is Friday on a holiday weekend, and we cut everyone loose early from my Law Office. It is quiet. My Road Glide sits outside, waiting to usher me home cloaked in the modern convenience aforementioned. I look up at the old bike on the wall, and while unrestored, I know its form and function when new. The ghosts of the men who piloted this bike speak to me. Theirs was not an easy lot to blaze trails on gravel roads sans cell phones and AAA. Here is what sets those souls who have passed to the afterlife apart from us. Things would be different if the clock were turned back 80 years when the bike in my office was new. A lot different. If I were lucky, my rusted 'wall-art' bike would have been hand built on a good day by one of the company's superior mechanics, a human, not a robot. It would have bias ply tube tires, cast heads with copper gaskets, real leather on her seat, and handmade bits and pieces. Not much imported sans the cork used in some of the gaskets and maybe the rubber grips and floorboard inserts. Oh, how things have changed.

I know what it's like to pilot a modern bike down a modern highway. Almost anyone can do it. I remember a time out in the American West a few years ago on my old panhead. I stopped roadside in awe of the great bison-filled plains around me. I listened to nothing but the tinking and pinging of the thick metal parts cooling off and contracting. The hiss perhaps of sweat splashing on a rusted header pipe. I rubbed my eyes and imagined for a moment that it was 1948. The war was over, and thousands of returning GI's were looking for the adventure they had feasted on, if they survived, on the beaches of Normandy, in the hedgerows of French farms, and the ruined cities of Germany. They turned to the bikes churned out by Harley, Indian, and Triumph, amongst others.

No biker gangs yet, no extra police scrutiny yet, no bad image to overcome or prejudice or overbearing government regulation. Just freedom on the open road. Yes, an occasional stop to adjust points, tighten rattling parts or swap roadside tires. But that is what made the adventure. Not a super duper Quickie-Mart gas station at every exit. Just mom and pop fill-ups few and far between, with a gallon milk jug in a saddlebag to bridge the gap. I wonder if it will ever be like that again. I doubt it. That time has passed. License endorsements, tag stickers, registration cards, insurance policies, emission stamps, and a plethora of government requirements and restrictions designed to extract money or control behavior. I miss my previous life if I had one. Don't get me wrong; this biker life is a good one. Being a biker nowadays is effortless and carefree. Almost anyone can do it. But then again, that may be part of my dilemma. We'll see what the next biker life holds. Maybe I'll ride with you there?

Well, signing off for now. Remember, ride hard, ride safe, and in the end make sure you ride home.



## What ever happened to Orange County Choppers?

Orange County Choppers confirmed the crew is moving to Florida.

On Dec. 15, Orange County Choppers posted on Facebook a mysterious video that showed a map of the United States with Florida highlighted.



"OCC - The next chapter... The future never

looked so bright! #OCC #PaulSr #NewYork #Florida #2021 #HereWeGo #HereWeCome #NewAdventure #Motorcycles #AreYouReady #StayTuned," the caption stated.

Days later Orange County Choppers shared another video. This one showed construction being done in Florida.

"And so it begins, the next chapter in the OCC story. Ground has been broken at the all-new OCC Roadhouse, Museum and Entertainment Complex in St. Petersburg, Florida," the caption stated.

The OCC Roadhouse & Museum is expected to open in the spring of 2021 in St. Petersburg. The complex which will feature a restaurant, shop, retail store and concert venue.

Paul Teutul Sr. later said why he's heading to Florida.

"There's more of a sense of freedom down there," Teutul Sr. told WKRG during a Zoom call. "I think I have more of a fan base down there in Florida and the riding season is nine months maybe even ten. In New York, you have a short season, maybe only three months or so. The whole thing makes sense."

He added politics and taxes played a major role in his decision.

"Sometimes it's just time for change, you know? Where I'm at in my life, it's time for change and you feel the freedom in Florida, you don't feel it so much in New York anymore," Teutul Sr. told WFLA.

Teutul Sr., his family and his OCC crew became famous on Discovery Channel's hit reality show American Chopper. Teutul Sr. confirmed there will be new episodes of the show from the Sunshine State, but his son, Paul Teutul Jr. won't be moving to Florida.

"Paul SR and the Orange County Choppers cast and crew are excited about moving their world-class headquarters to the St. Pete/Clearwater area in spring 2021.

Have you ever experienced that situation when you were planning to ride your motorcycle only to find out the battery was completely empty? There is nothing worse than being unable to ride because of a discharged motorcycle battery, especially when it can easily be avoided. This uncomfortable situation usually happens when your motorcycle has been sitting for a long period of time without actually being ridden. Most of the modern motorcycle batteries can withstand being left uncharged for multiple months or even a whole season. However, if you leave your motorcycle battery outside during winter, you are risking getting it completely drained. Its discharge time shortens significantly in extremely cold temperatures, therefore the battery should be stored properly. It is recommended to store your motorcycle battery in a room temperature and leave it connected to a specifically designed battery charger also called a "trickle charger" that will monitor its voltage level and recharge it if necessary. There are plenty of battery chargers available on the market today, but not all of them are that good for motorcycles. If you are not careful enough and try to use some unknown charger, you might actually end up damaging your motorcycle battery. You should use a charger that is designed specifically for motorcycle batteries.





In just a few weeks, 10 ABATE District 9 members will be leaving on this year's Miracle Ride. 21 riders will leave on May 22 and travel to the four corners of the United States. The ride will travel over 12,500 miles with most days' rides surpassing 500 miles. Of the 15 veteran Riders (all previous Ride veterans; not all military veterans) 10 are current members of ABATE District 9: our current D9 Treasurer, Doug Pullen, Brian Brock, Sheriff Mike Jolley, Scott Ressmeyer, Mutt Cooper, Jim Clapham, Ronnie Wilson, Jonnie Ellerbee, Gary McDowell, and Andy Whatley.

The Miracle Riders raise money for children's medical care in Columbus and the Chattahoochee Valley community. In eleven sponsored rides, the Riders have traveled the 48 contiguous states eight times. One year they rode to Alaska and the Arctic Circle and back. and another year with the help of air travel and rental bikes, they rode in all 50 states. In 2018, they rode to 16 different states over 15 days where they answered trivia questions on the morning news to determine their daily destinations. That year's ride earned the name The Magoo Ride because they had no idea where we were headed and some days they went hours out of their way before getting back on track.

In eleven sponsored rides over 14 years, the Riders have raised more than \$2.2 Million mostly for the Columbus Piedmont Regional Hospital's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. They have also supported caring organizations like the Feed The Valley Food Bank and the Methodist Girls and Boys Homes in the Columbus area just to name a few.

This year's ride is the second of three rides planned to raise \$1M for Columbus State University's Nursing School Simulation Lab. Their goal is to outfit the lab with state of the art technology to rival any university's Nursing Simulation Lab in the country. The Riders pay all their own expenses for fuel, maintenance, lodging, and food during the trip. Local companies and supporters sponsor their bikes and wrap them with their company logos in support of the group's efforts. They also sell sponsorships for the official ride shirts for each ride. In about a month this year's Ride t-shirts will be made available for purchase as a way for people to support their efforts to make a difference in a child's life.

The Riders will arrive home on June 16, to a return celebration on Broad Street in Uptown Columbus around 7 PM. This event will be highlighted by a highlight video of the ride and a live concert featuring The A-1-A Band - a popular Jimmy Buffett tribute band.
